



Complete Your Application

Complete the online Occupational Therapy Central Application System (OTCAS). The application cycle for OTCAS is from mid-July to March 6th annually. A priority deadline is the Third Friday of October annually to ensure the application is reviewed.

- Submit official transcripts from each college or university to OTCAS.
- Submit three letters of recommendation:1) Provided by an occupational therapist or another qualified allied health professional. /2) Provided by a professional who has observed the applicant's work/academic performance/3) Provided by a spiritual mentor or other mentor who has observed the applicant's character.
- Complete the personal statement in OTCAS.
- Complete the supplemental questions in OTCAS

Complete prerequisite Coursework

Complete the following prerequisite courses prior to start of the summer admission term with a minimum grade of a "C."

Prerequisite courses must be taken within 7 years of application.

- Sociology or Anthropology (3 hours)
- Abnormal Psychology/Psychopathology (3 hours)
- Lifespan Development/Developmental Psychology (3 hours)
- Statistics (3 hours)
- Anatomy (4 hours and must include a lab component)
- Physiology (4 hours and must include a lab component)
- Medical Terminology (1 to 3 hours or a certificate completion)

Complete Your degree

Complete a bachelor's degree from a regionally accredited college or university prior to the start of the summer admission term.

Harding University Occupational Therapy does not have a minimum cumulative or prerequisite GPA but strongly recommends a minimum GPA of 3.0. These standards reflect a greater opportunity for success with the curriculum and national board examination.

Admissions process

Applicants are reviewed through a rolling admissions process. However it is recommended that applicants submit their applications as early as possible.
