

Timothy "Mark" Egbuka 2024 Outstanding Alumnus

Dr. Egbuka graduated with a bachelor's degree in biology from Southeast Missouri State University in December 2010. He then earned a Doctor of Pharmacy in 2015 and a Master of Business Administration in 2016, both from Harding. Dr. Egbuka was inducted into the Omicron Delta Kappa National Leadership Honor Society and the Rho Chi Pharmacy Academic Honor Society. He was also honored with the Mylan Institute for Excellence in Pharmacy Award and the Arkansas Pharmacists Association Award for his outstanding academic and professional achievements.

Dr. Egbuka completed a postgraduate year one residency in pharmacy practice at Oregon Health and Science University Hospital and a postgraduate year two specialty residency



in Ambulatory Care at CoxHealth. He has achieved three board certifications through the Board of Pharmacy Specialties as a pharmacotherapy specialist, ambulatory care pharmacist and cardiology pharmacist.

Currently, he serves as a clinical pharmacist practitioner at Brooke Army Medical Center in San Antonio, Texas. In this role, he focuses on providing patient-centered chronic disease management through lifestyle medicine, disease state education and medication therapy to serve veterans and dependents of active-duty military personnel.
